Program Activities

- ◆ Traditional one-to-one support
- ◆ Goal oriented and strength-based Cultural Action Plans
- ◆ Traditional food education
- ◆ Coordinate Ojibway Language learning for families
- ◆ Connect with Elders and/or traditional resource people
- ◆ Support seasonal celebrations/ feasts, traditional and social events for the centre
- ◆ Implement Cultural programming



Program Activities cont'd:

- ◆ Provide space and opportunities for traditional arts & crafts
- ◆ Coordinate land-based activities, e.g. fishing, trapping, nature/medicine walks, medicine harvesting, berry picking, etc.,
- ◆ Create and maintain a trusted traditional knowledge/ Elder resource/directory
- ◆ Referrals and Advocacy
